A Message from His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor.

The Honorable Mr. Hazen, a Member of Her Majesty's Executive Council, by command of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, delivered the following Message :—

**“ New Brunswick.**

*“ Message to the House of Assembly, 28th February, 1844.*

“ W. M. G. COLEBROOKE, Lt. Governor.

“ The Lieutenant Governor, in reference to the Address of the House of the sixteenth instant, communicates to them a copy of the Regulations passed by him in Council on the 11th of May, 1843, for the disposal of Crown Lands: also, Returns of the Sales which have been effected under those Regulations, and Returns of the Stock and Produce raised in two Settlements, which are in progress.

The House went into Committee of the whole on a Bill to amend an Act, intituled “ An Act to repeal an Act to encourage the destroying of Wolves, and an Act to grant a Bounty on the destruction of Bears in this Province, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.”

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported, that the Committee having the Bill referred to them under their consideration, had made amendments thereto, and then agreed to the said Bill.

*Ordered,* That the Report be accepted and the Bill engrossed as amended.
